Practical Conservation Activities

The objective of the two practical conservation projects for IYPF is to offset some of the carbon footprint from flying delegates from around the world to the Summit and to involve them in a practical biodiversity focused project, which links directly back to MDG 7 "Ensure environmental sustainability".

Blackleach Country Park is an urban fringe site used widely by the local community. It is home to a mosaic of habitats including woodlands, grasslands and wetlands providing a valuable recreational green space. The IYPS delegates will clear a section of a former railway line and plant it with more suited native tree species and wildflowers. The planting will improve the area's biodiversity, which in turn will encourage more wildlife, enhance the walk for visitors and make the area easier to manage in the future.

Clifton Country Park Local Nature Reserve is approximately 48 hectares of scenic urban fringe countryside in Salford, with woods, meadows, ponds and a lake to explore and remnants of the city's industrial past to discover. Our volunteers will help to extend a set of steps, which will enable visitor's better access to the Arboretum. This work will help to deliver the sites Conservation Management Plan and maintain its Green Flag status.
